Marco Formisano received a Ph.D. in Classics from the University of Palermo in 2000, and in 2013 joined the Department of Literature at the University of Ghent,



where he teaches Latin Language and Literature. He is also an affiliated member of the Collaborative Research Center (SFB) 644 "Transformations of Antiquity" based at the Humboldt University in Berlin. In addition to the literature of late antiquity, a major focus of his work is the literature of knowledge: he explores the literary dimension of ancient texts on science and technology, such as medicine, veterinary medicine, architecture, warfare, and land surveying. In particular, he has published extensively on the art of war as a literary genre from classical Greece through the early and late Roman empire to the Renaissance.
