

Graduate Summer Fellowships Call for Applications Deadline: May 1

Purpose: The Institute of Arts and Humanities (IAH) seeks to support completion of dissertations that relate to one of the following four themes.

- 1. Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion, with a focus on race, ethnicity, and social justice;
- 2. <u>Global Arts and Humanities</u>, with attention to linking investigation of seemingly disparate people and places across geographic, cultural, and chronological boundaries;
- 3. <u>Public Arts and Humanities</u>, with a commitment to collaboration with local and regional libraries, museums, and community forums; and
- 4. <u>Digital Arts and Humanities</u>, with concentration on how digital tools and technology can create and support research, pedagogy, and university/community interface.

Eligibility: Applications are invited from UC San Diego graduate students in Arts and Humanities who will have advanced to candidacy by July 1. MFA students are not eligible. Students must be registered for the Spring or Fall, and not have reached their support limit.

Award Amount: Up to \$1,000. The timing and method of distribution will be determined after discussion with the student's home department.

Award Period: Activities should take place in the summer (late June-early September).

Application Process: Please complete the forms on the following pages with:

- 1. Full name
- 2. Department and advisor
- 3. Month and year you advanced to candidacy
- 4. Dissertation title and description
- 5. Description of activities and budget (you may request support for items needed to complete research, or support for living expenses while writing)
- 6. How the project relates to one of the four themes listed above
- 7. Information on whether/how you have participated in IAH activities over the last year
- 8. Other sources applied to for support and their status (awarded, pending, denied)
- 9. Timeline of dissertation

Award Process: Awardees will be notified in June and IAH will coordinate with the student's home department.

Reporting: Please submit a one-page report by September 30 describing your progress on the proposed activities.
