From Petition and Response to Lobbying: Letters as a way of Influencing Official Decisions in Late Antiquity

Taking their starting point from Fergus Millar's petition and response model, scholars of Late Antiquity have tended to focus on petitions in the strict, legalistic sense of the word. Letters, however, were another important way of influencing official decisions. This paper studies the epistolary collection of Libanius of Antioch (ca.314-393 A.D.) to examine how letters could be used to lobby emperors.
